

## Reproduction of DIN Standards

- in literature (such as in books, technical journals, and similar publications)
- for advertising purposes (such as in catalogues, product lists, brochures, etc.)

DIN Standards, which include DIN IEC, DIN ISO, DIN ISO/IEC, DIN EN, DIN EN ISO and DIN EN ISP or DIN ETS Standards and their drafts, Supplements and Preliminary Standards (referred to below collectively as 'DIN Standards'), are protected by copyright within the meaning of the *Urheberrechtsgesetz* (German Copyright Act). Without prejudice to the non-transferability of personal rights as laid down in that Act, *DIN Deutsches Institut für Normung e.V.* ('DIN', for short), as the national body responsible for standardization work, exercises the rights transferred to it for the exclusive utilization and exploitation of that work. In the case of DIN VDE Standards, DIN and the *Verband der Elektrotechnik, Elektronik und Informationstechnik e.V.* (VDE) jointly exercise that right.

To carry out standardization work, DIN relies on the sale of DIN Standards. DIN Standards may only be reproduced with the permission of DIN, and only for certain purposes and in certain forms, provided this does not conflict with the vested interests of DIN. Only originals of DIN Standards may be reproduced (irrespective of whether on paper or data carrier), these having been duly acquired by purchase.

'Reproduction' is the utilization of a DIN Standard to duplicate its content in a readily or non-readily discernible form and is understood to include such methods as photocopying, printing, preparation of microforms, transcribing, scanning, data transfer, etc.

Note that DIN does not provide drawings or clichés for reproduction purposes. DIN Standards can be purchased at any time in paper form or on data carriers from Beuth Verlag GmbH, 10772 Berlin, Germany, or by downloading from the website at [www.beuth.de](http://www.beuth.de).

### General

The following conditions do not apply to DIN VDE Standards, details concerning permission for reproduction of which are dealt with in *DIN-VDE-Merkblatt für die Wiedergabe von DIN-VDE-Normen in anderen Publikationen*.

Application for permission to reproduce DIN Standards shall be made in writing to the *Rechtsabteilung* (Legal Department) of DIN, Burggrafenstrasse 6, 10787 Berlin, Germany. If a DIN Standard is to be reproduced in its entirety, its number and date of publication and, if relevant, its Part number, shall be stated on the application; if only extracts are to be reproduced, the extract(s) required shall be specified (e.g. number of clause, figure or table). Wherever possible, a draft of the printer's copy shall be submitted at the time of application. The number of copies intended to be printed shall also be specified.

It is strongly recommended that no reproductions be made until permission to do so has been received. Reproduction without permission to do so constitutes an infringement entailing liability to damages and is punishable by law. For reproductions made without the prior consent of DIN, but for which DIN subsequently grants permission, a surcharge of 100 % of the regular fee will be due.

### Special terms

- 1 The permission for reproduction and dissemination expressly excludes the right to reproduce DIN Standards in intangible form for third parties or to make them available to third parties, for example online.
- 2 A fee is due for all reproductions, irrespective of their format, which reflect the original text of a DIN Standard either wholly or partially, and irrespective of whether the text is given verbatim or substantially unaltered. Examples of insubstantial modifications are the inclusion of a company's name, logo or reference number, and the omission or modification of the frame enclosing the text.
- 3 Permission to reproduce a DIN Standard in its entirety will not be granted until six months after the standard has been published.

- 4 Reproductions of entire standards shall be permanently incorporated in the publication. If reproductions of DIN Standards are intended to be included in loose-leaf or ring binders, DIN will grant permission only if the reproduced standard is presented in such a way that it is clearly distinguishable from the original version.

Where DIN Standards are to be reproduced in their entirety, not more than 10 DIN Standards, consisting of not more than 40 pages total, may be reproduced. In all cases, including such where only extracts are to be reproduced, the sum total of all such reproductions shall not constitute more than one-third of the body of the publication.

- 5 In granting permission to make reproductions, DIN does not assume liability for their accuracy.

Reproduction is strictly limited to the number of copies for which permission was originally granted. Any subsequent editions or reprints, or any other type of publication in which reproductions are to appear shall require a renewed application for reproduction and the permission of DIN.

- 6 The following notice shall be included, either in a footnote on the reproduction itself or in a suitable position elsewhere in the publication:

**'Reproduced by permission of DIN Deutsches Institut für Normung e.V.  
The definitive version for the implementation of this standard is the edition  
bearing the most recent date of issue, obtainable from Beuth Verlag GmbH,  
10772 Berlin, Germany.'**

If the reproduction itself does not evince the DIN number, then an appropriate reference shall be made (in a footnote, for example) to indicate which DIN Standard has been reproduced.

- 7 If the document is to appear in its entirety, the fee to be paid per copy made is calculated as follows:

of the relevant price of the original.

The fee for the reproduction of extracts is calculated as a proportion of the total number of pages of which the document consists, on the basis of the above table.

A lump sum will be charged for new editions of publications which have become well-established in the technical literature market and which primarily consist of extracts compiled from one or more DIN Standards.

- 8 A complimentary copy of the finished publication is to be forwarded to the *DIN-Rechtsabteilung*, and the total number of copies produced shall be stated.
